Symptoms.

GYGSC recognizes the importance of minimizing the risk of coronavirus to members and people sailing at Gorleston. The following risk assessment has been carried out to reduce the risks to sailors using the club.


The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of a new continuous cough and/or high temperature, or loss or changed sense of normal smell or taste (anosmia). If you have these symptoms, however mild, do not go to the club but follow Government guidance which states you should stay at home and not leave your house for 7 days from when your symptoms started (if you live alone), or 14 days (if you live with someone who has symptoms). If anyone becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature or loss of taste or smell while at the club, they should go home and follow the stay at home guidance. A Club Officer should be informed of this illness. If you share a home with someone who has the symptoms of coronavirus, stay at home and do not come to the club for 14 days

Area	Controls Implemented	Date Updated
Clubhouse	Members are required to wear a facemask when in the clubhouse.	23/03/2021
	Access only for the following and for as short a time as possible:	
	SUPs – members may access the clubhouse to retrieve and return SUPS.	
	Safety Boat Equipment – Rib crew may retrieve the radios from the clubhouse. Radios should be cleaned and sanitised before and after use.	
	Toilets - Members are to avoid the use of toilets as far as possible. Members must ensure good standards of hygiene are adhered to and ensure that all surfaces, taps and door handles are sanitised, Hands should be sanitised on entering and exiting the building.	
	Access to fridge - see catering



Area	Controls Implemented	Date
	move boats, in order to maintain social distancing.	
Activities	Casual Sailing and Racing. Sailors are entirely responsible for their own safety, there will be very limited organised safety boat cover. The club will communicate when it is open for sailing. The club is open for SUP water activities.	28/06/2020
Safety on the water	Ribs to be manned by members of the same household only. Safety cover will be more limited than usual as powerboats when launched are likely to be single manned. A boat is responsible for its own safety and members must make an individual assessment of the weather conditions and whether or not it is safe to launch.	28/06/2020
Two man boats	Helm and crew from different households must follow RYA guidelines for sailing with people not in their household. RYA Sailing & Racing in Mixed Households.pdf	13/09/2020
Commonly touched surfaces	e.g. Gate lock, toilet doors and lock and door handles to the shed. Members to bring their own hand sanitising gel and use it regularly when touching surfaces. Single use gloves will also be acceptable.	17/06/2020
